



Representability

Non-generic

Non-functional

No identity or likelihood of confusion with older marks

signs (words, incl. personal names, designs, letters, numerals, colors, shape of goods or packaging of goods, sounds)

in principle, distinguishing goods or services of one undertaking from those of other undertakings

in the register to allow determination of protection

distinguishing in relation to claimed goods & services

proximity of sign and claimed goods & services

customary in language or in established trade practices

characteristics resulting from goods themselves

identity of marks + goods or services covered by both marks

identity with or similarity to earlier mark + identity or similarity of goods or services covered by both marks


No part of the state of the art: everything made public before filing (or priority) - written, oral, use, or otherwise


having regard to the state of the art, not obvious to the person skilled in the art

can be made or used in any kind of industry, including agriculture





Individual character

appearance of the whole or a part of a product (industrial or handicraft item, assemblies: packaging, symbols, typefaces)

No identical design available to public before filing (or priority)

overall impression on the informed user differs from the impression by any other available design







Concept of Priority



- Patents can only be granted if novel > not forming part of the prior art
- Prior art = everything published anywhere anyhow before filing date

How can I obtain
a **foreign** patent
after filing a **first** patent
in my home country?



Concept of Priority the wings of international IP

intellectual property | international

- → On the basis of a first application filed in one of the Contracting States, the applicant may, within a certain period
 - 12 months for patents and utility models
 - 6 months for designs and trademarks
 apply for protection in any of the other Contracting States
- → These subsequent applications will be regarded as if they had been filed on the same day as the first application
- → In other words, they will have priority over applications filed by others during the said period of time for the same invention, utility model, trademark or design





International IP Filing



definition

an invention whose implementation involves the use of a computer, computer network or other programmable apparatus, whereby features of the claimed invention are realized by means of a computer program = ,Computer Implemented Invention' - CII

technical problem be solved

claims with technical character

internal (hardware-related) or external (physical effect outside of computer system) technical effects required

How to patent software?

examples

use of a neural network in a heart monitoring apparatus for the purpose of identifying irregular heartbeats

classification of digital images based on low-level features

optimizing load distribution in a computer network

selection of content with tap/hold/release gesture to perform the technical task of selecting an item of content on the display

querying a dedicated server to determine whether a mobile device is NFC enabled
